

Mozambique Gap 1



Lack of human resources at
primary health care (PHC) level

Priority interventions

- Recruit and train community health workers (CHWs) and deploy them to areas of need through the Global Financing Facility (GFF)
- Work with civil society to advocate for budget allocation for hiring more qualified human resources (learn from Ethiopia's experience)
- Build from experiences of the integrated referral networks in Nampula Province to scale up the model and improve management of human resources at the local government level

Priority inputs required to implement the interventions

- Funds to train new CHWs – GFF funds already planned
- Technical assistance (TA) for the training of CHWs
- TA and funding for scaling up integrated referral networks

Timeline

- Training of CHWs: 2018-2023
- Advocacy for budget allocation for hiring more health professionals: 2nd and 3rd trimester of 2019
- Scale up of integrated referral networks for improved management of health human resources at the local government level: 2019 - 2023

Gap 2



Low quality of nutrition service
delivery

Priority interventions

- Build from Kenya's experience to develop a Building Capacity Framework to ensure technical competency and knowledge of job descriptions of different actors delivering nutrition services, as well as continuous training (on the job), mentoring and supportive supervision
- Capacity building of MOH officers (at all levels) on monitoring and evaluation, to conduct regular data analysis meetings (including scale up of child mortality audits)
- Integration of supply chain management skills in on-the-job trainings (including integration of nutrition commodity management in training manual for managing supply chain of medical products), so distribution of commodities is based on requests (bottom-up) rather than a top-down distribution approach

Priority inputs required to implement the interventions

- Funding
- Technical assistance

Timeline

- Adapt Capacity Building Framework from Kenya to the Mozambican context: 2019-2020
- Capacity building of MOH officers on M&E: 2nd half of 2019
- Integration of nutrition commodity management in on-the-job trainings: 2019-2021

Gap 3



Weak integration of nutrition in newborn and child health interventions at the various levels of the health system

Priority interventions

- Leverage review periods of relevant newborn and child health guidelines, training manuals and supervision tools to ensure that gaps in nutrition integration are addressed
- Include time for dissemination of relevant guidelines and policies/strategies/plans in existing meetings, trainings, seminars, etc. and use Whatsapp groups and other modern technological means of sharing information
- Review and disseminate job descriptions of nutritionists and display them in health facilities, district health directorates, and provincial health directorates
- Provide guidance from the MOH to frontline health workers to disseminate high priority nutrition key messages listed in the SBCC strategy for the prevention of undernutrition in all entry points
- Improve coordination between child health and nutrition departments of the MOH (at all levels)

Priority inputs required to implement the interventions

- Technical assistance

Timeline

- Review relevant newborn and child health guidelines, training manuals and supervision tools to ensure that gaps in nutrition integration are addressed: 2019-2023
- Dissemination of relevant guidelines and policies/strategies/plans in existing meetings, trainings, seminars, and via WhatsApp groups: 2019
- Review and disseminate job descriptions of nutritionists and display them in health facilities, district health directorates, and provincial health directorates: First semester of 2019
- Provide guidance from the MOH to frontline health workers to disseminate high priority nutrition key messages listed in the SBCC strategy for the prevention of undernutrition in all entry points: 2019
- Improve coordination between child health and nutrition departments of the MOH (at all levels): Now!
