CHNRI Update (Salim Sadruddin)	<ul> <li>MCHIP is supporting partnership with Programme for Global Pediatric Research (Alvin Zipursky, Kerri Wozniak) with whom Salim has met twice. Salim is Research Coordinator supported by PGPR, Mark Young, Shamim Qazi, Kerry Ross and David Marsh (others welcome).</li> <li>Now 156 research questions! MCHIP explored posting interactive list, but not feasible.</li> <li>Steps: (1) Currently have ~100 experts (including CCM.ORG, plus Geneva "Fever" group), but Asia under-represented. Kerry Ross still accepting names. (2) PGPR will invite experts to submit up to 4 questions through April. (3) Advisors to meet face-to-face in Apr-May to pre-prioritize the list to a manageable number. (4) PGPR will request same experts to score ~100 questions.
