Background

In June 2012, the DRC participated in the Child Survival Call to Action and committed by 2035 to:

- Accelerate the reduction of maternal, child and neonatal mortality to a maximum of 20 deaths for 1,000 live births
- Improve overall access to quality health care and prevention services.

The government-led Call for Action (or 'APR,' A Promise Renewed) in DRC is being led by an integrated committee including all key partners and donors involved in the health sector in the DRC. With support from UNICEF, USAID and other actors, the government has developed **an action framework** with detailed strategies and the potential to address bottlenecks in the health system as well as barriers that prevent access to health services. This Action Framework aims to reduce under-five mortality by 48% and maternal mortality by 31%, saving the lives of 430,000 children and 7,900 mothers.

Facts about Child Survival in DRC

- Under-five mortality rate is 158/1,000 live births, infant mortality is 97/1,000 live births (MICS2010).
- Neonatal mortality is 47 and adjusted maternal mortality rate is 1,100/100,000 live births (SOWC 2009).
- Malaria affects 27 per cent of children under five years of age but only 39 per cent of them have access to anti-malarial treatment.
- Acute respiratory infections (ARI) affects 6 per cent of under-five children and 42 per cent of affected children have access to treatment (MICS2010).
- Diarrhea affects 18 per cent of children under five years of age and 39 per cent of affected children have access to the recommended treatment. Seventy five per cent of births occur in a health facility and 74 per cent of births are attended by skilled health personnel.
- No polio case was reported since December 2011 [100 cases were reported in 2010 and 93 cases in 2012]. Measles outbreaks still persist in 10 provinces (except South Kivu province).
- Stunting affects 43 per cent of children under five years of age and wasting over 9 per cent of children (MICS2010). In absolute terms this translates into more than 5 million stunted children and 1.3 million wasted.
- 71 per cent of children under-five years of age and 53 per cent of women of child bearing age suffer from anaemia (DHS2007).
- Only 37 per cent of children aged less than 6 months are exclusively breastfed and, though up to 64 per cent of children receive complementary foods, feeding frequency and the quality of these foods are inadequate (MICS2010).
