






Diarrhea: 36,810

Background

 In 2011 a national scale-up plan was developed but Federal MOH was decentralized

• If national scale-up targets are achieved, more than 29,000 potential lives can be saved by 2015.

Progress Last Quarter

- National launch of GAPPD on August 22, 2013 in Karachi
- Consultant selected for developing provincial actions plans for KP and Balochistan
- Resources also committed for supporting provincial action plan for Punjab through corporate donor (Reckitt & Benckiser) in 2014
- Concept proposal developed for scale up of D & P prevention and control in two provinces (KP and Balochistan)
- Key stakeholders: Aga Khan Univ., JSI-Deliver, Pakistan Medical Association, Pakistan Pediatrics Association, Save the Children, UNICEF, and WHO among others

National Scale-up Plan Endorsed (In Progress)

Provincial scale-up plans development in progress.

Consultant hired and will start individual and group meetings with Department of Health and other stakeholders in 2 provinces

Will hold formal consultation meetings for development of provincial essential medicines scale-up plans.

Plan to complete provincial plans as early as Dec. 2013

Coordinating Mechanism Established (In Progress)

Work of consultant with Provincial stakeholders will set the stage for establishing a coordinating mechanism in each province.



Key Issues for Discussion & Support

• Increased donor attention to diarrhea and pneumonia – current child health programming is a small part of overall MNCH procurements by major donors (DFID, USAID etc...). Leadership by donors will contribute to increasing government attention to P & D interventions.
