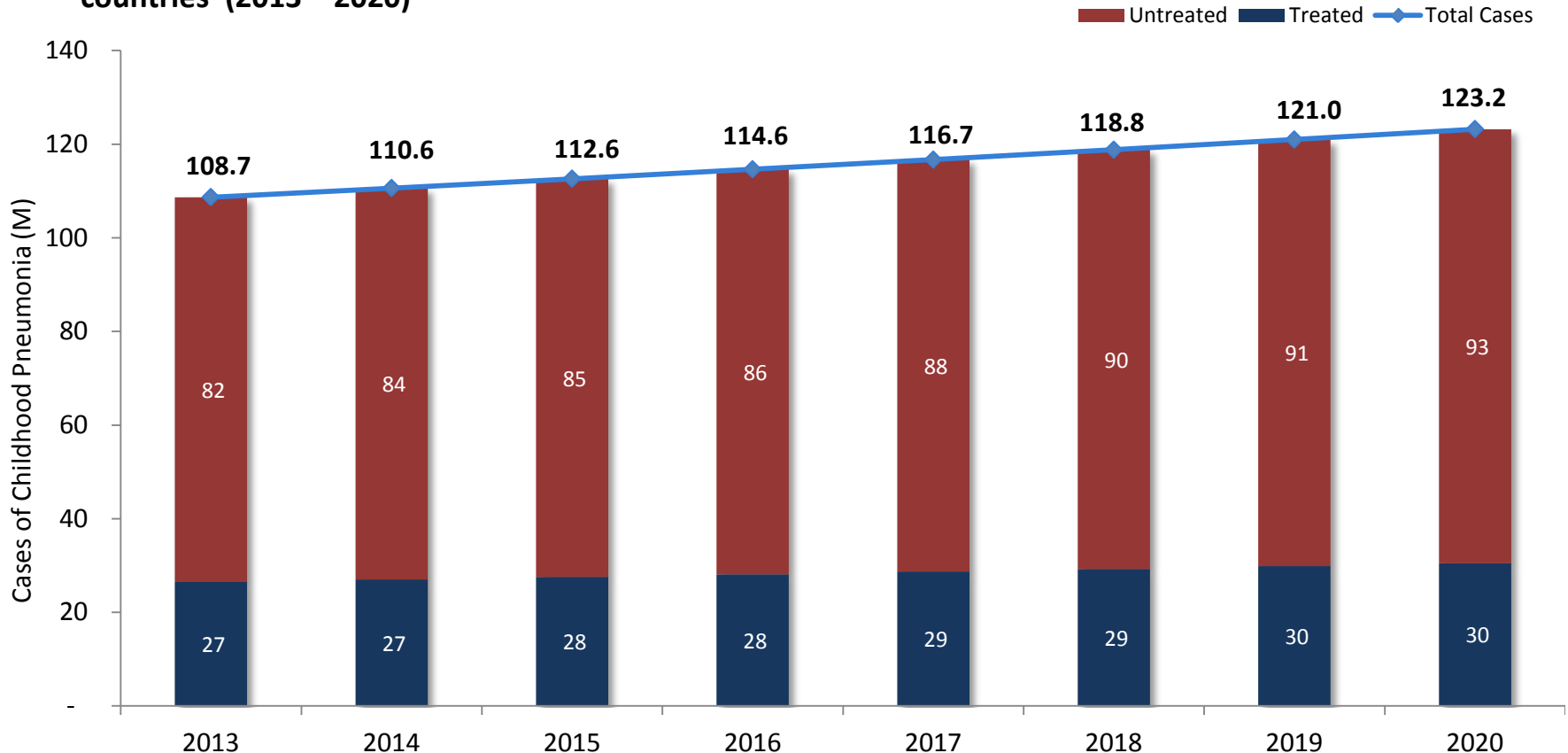


Up to 82 million cases of suspected childhood pneumonia may not currently receive antibiotics...

	Commitment	Ambition – <i>work in progress</i>
1	Greater transparency around private sector pricing of essential medicines	a. with partners advocate & attain reduction on import duty for Essential Medicines from 18% to 8% by end 2013
2	Supporting registration, supply and distribution of Commission commodities	a. complete registration of Clamoxyl 250mg sachet within 2013 b. Push to reach x% (tbc) of all prescribers in DRC with Clamoxyl at a maximum price of x per child treatment dose by 2014
3	Education and training to support the key actions agreed by the working groups.	a. support ID society of FWC Africa to develop by end 2013 guidance booklet on rational use of antibiotics b. print 8800 copies of guidance booklet for MoH by end 2013 c. support training of HCW on IMCI <ul style="list-style-type: none"> i.
