
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
Evaluation methods and analysis

proportion of the diarrhea cases treated by HF and CHWs



 Use periodic assessments for information that is complex or subject to bias (i.e., drug availability, CHW performance) Use routine data on treatments for estimating coverage (i.e., treatments provided, children received)

% of CHWs meeting standards



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Way forward for evaluations

Information obtained	Frequency	Method
Treatment rates vs. expected incidence	routine	compilation of register information
CHW skills and performance Drug availability	periodic	observation
Care seeking behaviour Timeliness of treatment	baseline/final	household survey
Deaths averted	baseline/final	modeling packages

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
