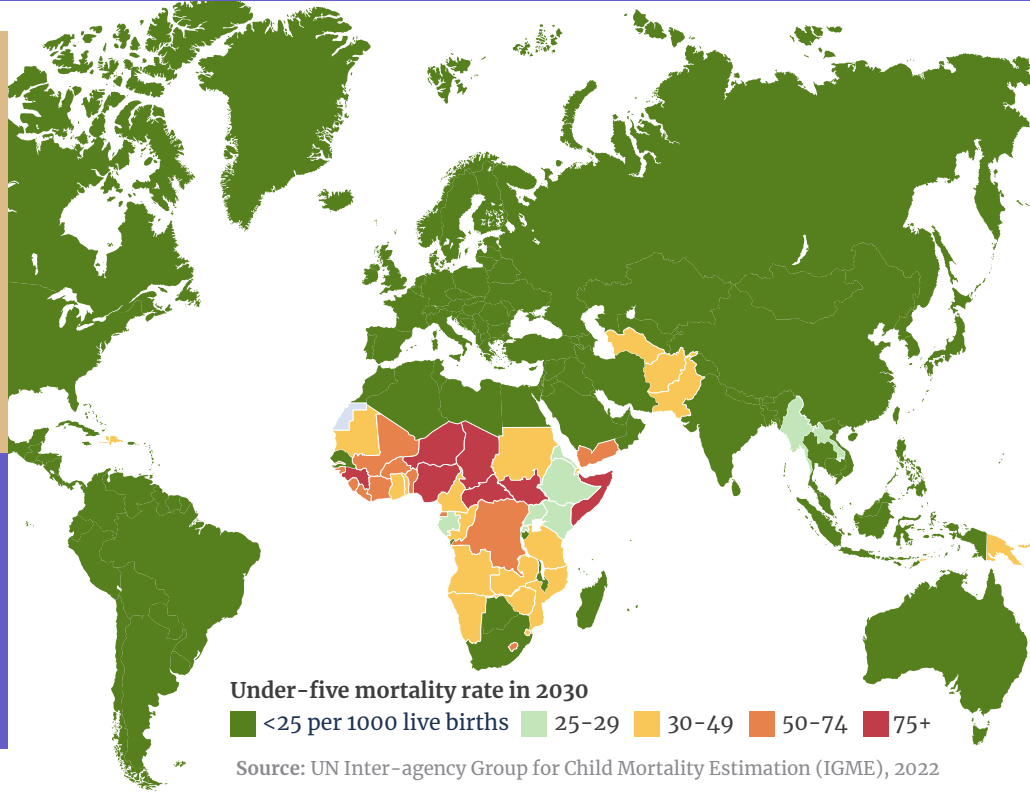
WE NEED TO ACT!

There are only 7 years left for countries to achieve the SDG targets

In 2021, 5 million children under the age of five died before their 5th birthday

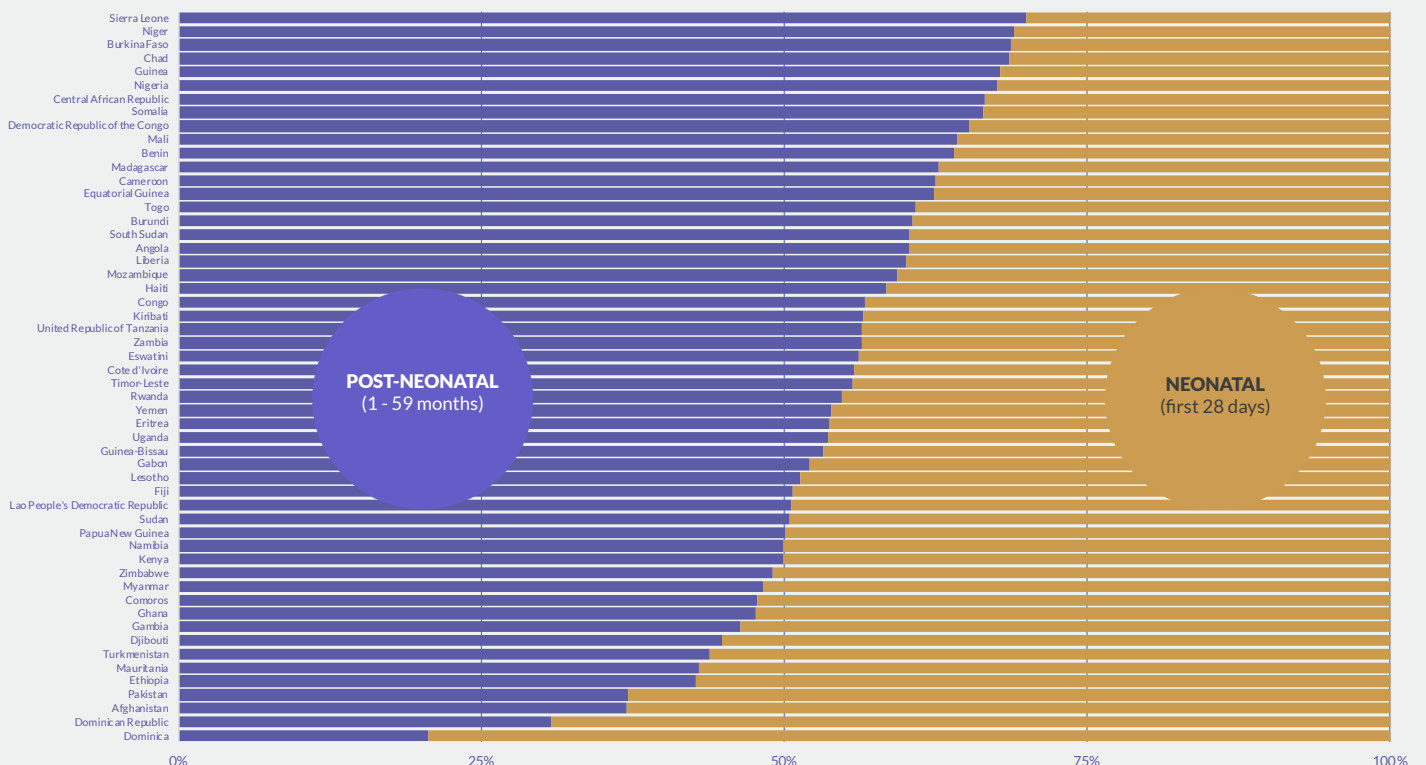
Without accelerated action, 54 countries are not on track to meet the SDG target of 25 or fewer deaths per 1,000 live births

54 countries need accelerated action to meet the child survival SDG by 2030;
almost **80%** are in Africa



- Pneumonia, Diarrhea and Malaria remain the leading, preventable causes of death in this age group
- Under-nutrition is a key risk factor for mortality
- Nevertheless, resource-constrained countries have demonstrated that the target is achievable

A SIGNIFICANT PROPORTION OF UNDER-FIVE DEATHS OCCUR AMONG CHILDREN AGED 1-59 MONTHS

2 Accountability at all levels for change

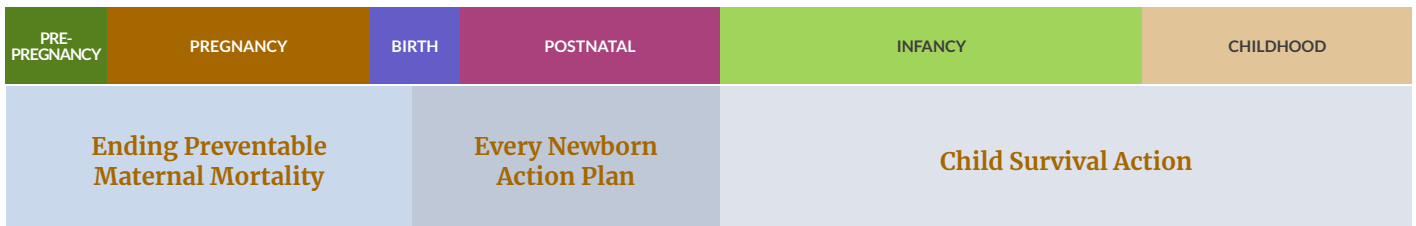
3 Multi-sectoral responses that align with national strategies and plans
